Two or more students actively participated.					
All students participated in answering questions from the judges.

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Team Presentation Scoring

Points Possible: 500

Score multiplied by 6.25

Novice:  $1 * 6.25 = 6.25$

Emerging:  $2 * 6.25 = 12.5$

Proficient:  $3 * 6.25 = 18.75$

Accomplished:  $4 * 6.25 = 25$

Exemplary:  $5 * 6.25 = 31.25$

Maximum points  $31.25 * 16 = 500$
