Approval of Board Meeting Minutes

McCarthy Snyder moved to approve the minutes from the January 13, 2022 meeting, McWhorter seconded and the motion passed.

Finance & Audit Report

McCarthy Snyder asked Bruun to review the financial reports with the board. He also reviewed the Mill Levy Budget to date and said everything was on track.

FY2023 Mill Levy Budget Review & Approval

Bruun reviewed the FY2023 Mill Levy budget and discussed the new layout which includes a percent of total budgeted expense for each major expense category. A new line item for FY 2023 is University Strategic Initiatives. This budget is to allow the Board to take advantage of opportunities related to the University President's strategic initiatives as they may arise. In the Financial Plan a new section was also added - the Board Initiatives fund section which will hold the Board's unrestricted cash that is available for new initiatives. McCarthy Snyder asked for motion to approve the FY23 budget, Everett seconded and the motion passed.

Campus Development Report

Schlapp discussed the Foundation's request for insulation and sealing of 17 windows in Woodman Alumni Center to cut wind infiltration. McWhorter asked for motion to approve the quote amount of \$9119.67. Harter seconded and the motion passed. Schlapp also talked about the on-going discussions with the Foundation about the lease agreement between BOT/Foundation, he will have more details at the July meeting.

Applied Learning Discussion

Witherspoon informed the group about the student applied and experiential learning opportunities available at Wichita State with the Shocker Career Accelerator group from Co-op Education and Internships, On-Campus Employment and Innovation Campus Opportunities with our partners. They also offer services such as the Career Closet, career counseling, interview prep, job search, LinkedIn Learning, employer connections, professional photos and resume review.

University Update

Schlapp discussed Dr. Muma's focus on providing affordable education access to students, supporting business with a talent pipeline and increasing the economic prosperity of south central Kansas and the region.
