Harter asked for motion to accept the report. Winters moved, Packebush seconded and the motion passed.

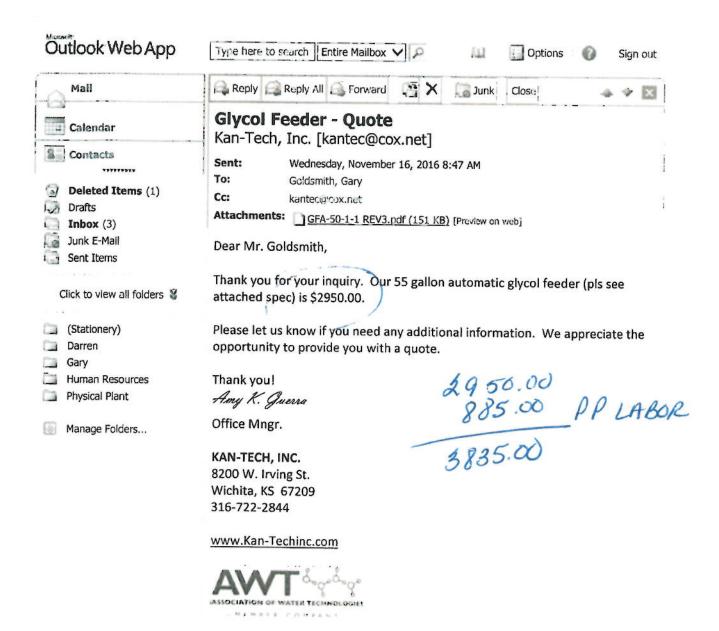

CHYCOLIMAKIE UP TANIK

The chiller that takes care of Woodman Alumni Center has a closed loop chilled water system. The chilled water pipes run outdoors to the chiller. Because these water lines are outdoors they have to be treated with an antifreeze solution (glycol). The chilled water circuit at Woodman was drained presumably during construction and we were not aware. We have since replaced the glycol that was drained. At today's price that amount of glycol is right at \$4,000.00. The system is now protected but the method of how we make up the chilled water, if there is a leak, is what needs to be addressed. Currently, water is made up directly from the city and it is untreated (no glycol). What would be best is if we had this closed loop make up tank that would feed the treated water on demand, in the case of a leak. This would also give the technician information about the equipment that he is maintaining.

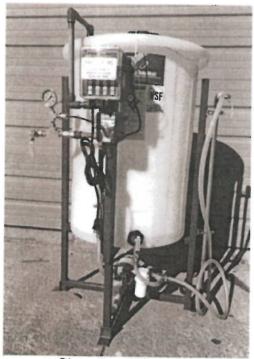
