

Public Health Code of Ethics

Public Health...involves remediation of structural and institutional forms of domination that arise from inequalities related to voice, power, and wealth.

It is difficult for public health to promote health justice at the transactional level if it does not take steps to promote it at the structural and institutional levels as well. –APHA 2019
