Native American Storytelling under the Stars

On Friday, March 27, join us around a campfire at the Lake Afton Public Observatory for a very special evening of Native American storytelling. The North American plains tribes had constellations, stars and legends unique to their culture just as the Greeks and Romans did. Hear some of the many wonderful sacred star stories Native American tribes told and learn how the night skies influenced tribal life. The Native American Storytelling program will take place on Friday, March 27 in the field to the West of the Observatory building. Your host, Native American Jan Brooks of the Ojibwe tribe, will begin her first story at 8:30 p.m.

Seating is not provided so you will want to bring a folding chair or blanket to sit on and a good bug repellent. There is no charge for the *Native American Storytelling* program, however if you would also like to take in the Observatory's regularly scheduled program, and explore the exhibits, regular admission charges will apply. If skies are cloudy and it looks like it might rain, please check the Observatory's program information line after 6:00 pm to see if the Storytelling program has been canceled or postponed. Opening Times and Admission

During March, the Lake Afton Public Observatory is open to the public on Friday and Saturday evening from 8:00 pm until 10:00 pm. Admission is just \$6 for adults and \$4 for children ages 6-12; children under 6 are admitted free. There is also a special family rate where 2 parents and their immediate minor children or grandchildren get in for just \$18.00.
