Job Market in Sports Still Strong

TeamWork Online, a Web service that advertises jobs available in all the major professional sports leagues and with major sport entertainment companies, estimates it posted roughly 750 positions in 2003. What types of jobs are most common? The following table provides an estimated breakdown by category.

Job Category	Est. Percentage
Ticket Sales	30%
Miscellaneous Internships	20%
Facility Management/Operations	15%
Corporate Sponsorship Sales	10%
General Administration/Office Mgt.	10%
Public/Community/Media Relations	10%
Marketing/Fan Development	5%
Broadcast, Finance, Game Operations,	
Retail, Web Design/Interactive/Network	Minimal

Other services that list jobs in other sectors of the sport industry would no doubt offer different statistics. However, the above table does bear out that if one wants to work in pro sport, sales skills are highly valued.



Fellowship criteria are:

- * Enrolled in the Graduate School at WSU with full-standing status
- * Accepted into the graduate program in sport administration

Awards will be made with regard to financial need, which will be assessed the department scholarship committee based on the information provided by the applicants

Applicants should submit to Clay Stoldt a letter of application addressing their qualifications for the award. Application deadline is March 1.

Graduate Program Applications Now Being Accepted for 2004-05

Applications are now being accepted for admission to the sport administration master's program in 2004-05. Review of applications begins Feb. 2 and will continue until the program reaches its capacity of 30 new students.

Applicants will need to complete an application and provide official transcripts and GRE scores (optional depending on GPA) to the Graduate School. They will also be required to submit a letter of application, three letters of recommendations and a resume to the sport administration program. Lecturer Profile

Mark Vermillion, a recent WSU master's degree recipient in sociology, will teach KSS 475 - Sport in American Culture this spring. He is currently pursuing his doctoral degree at Oklahoma State University and is developing a specialization in sport sociology. Mark served as an intern with the sport administration faculty last summer, contributing to numerous program initiatives including the development of a program assessment report. He is also collaborating with members of the sport administration faculty on a research project that has both sport sociological and sport public relations implications.

Faculty Update

Work continues on finding another full-time individual to join the sport administration faculty next fall. The position has been officially approved, the search plan authorized, and applications have been accepted. Members of the search committee will be reviewing candidate applications and developing a final recommendation in January and February.

Major of Year Nominations Accepted

Nominations are now being accepted for the Sport Administration Undergraduate and Graduate Major of the Year Awards.

The undergraduate MOY award is open to any undergraduate sport administration student who has achieved junior status at WSU, has been a student at WSU for a minimum of one year, and has declared sport administration as a major.

The graduate award is open to any graduate sport administration student who has completed 24 credit hours or more in the program or who graduated in the fall semester.

For either award, candidates may nominate themselves or be nominated by others (students, faculty, constituents). Each letter of nomination should specify the candidate's identity and a rationale for consideration and should be accompanied by an updated resume.

Nominations for both awards will be accepted through Feb. 14. Members of the sport administration faculty will review nominations and select the eventual winners. Faculty assessments will be based on academic performance in the program, relevant professional experience gained while in the program, and service to the program (e.g. SASA, assistance with program initiatives, etc.).

Undergraduate nominations should be sent to Steve Dittmore, undergraduate program coordinator. Graduate nominations should be go to Clay Stoldt, graduate program coordinator. The award winners will be announced at the annual KSS Recognition Night in April.

Good Job Leads ...

While specific information had yet to be received when this newsletter went to print, internships with Disney's Wide World of Sports are usually posted in January with recommendations due in February.

The Omaha Classic golf tournament has three paid and one non-paid internship available this summer. The positions offer a unique opportunity for insight into the realm of the PGA Tour and event management. Students should send resumes right away as interviews begin in February.

The Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission and the Kansas Sports Hall of Fame are seeking students for internship possibilities through June. The sports commission has a long history of working with sport administration students by offering opportunities to assist with events such as the Kansas Kids Wrestling Classic and Johnny Bench Award.

The Kansas Sports Hall of Fame recently relocated to Old Town in Wichita and is preparing for its 2004 induction ceremony in May at the Hyatt Regency Hotel.


