How long have you been working in the position that you currently hold and how did you arrive in that position?

I have been with GCSAA for four years in the Corporate Sales & Marketing department. After leaving WSU, I started out in the fitness industry working in operations and special events for both corporate and private facilities. From there, I was able to get my foot in the door at GCSAA because of my Sport Management degree and because I was able to show concrete proof that my events were directly related to sales for those facilities.

In what ways do you feel that the WSU Sport Management Department (SMGT) prepared you for you current position?

The marketing lessons I learned while at WSU have been invaluable.
