SPED 847IT	ECU: Practicum and Field Experience, Infants Toddlers, and Families	3-4	All	Must be taken with or after SPED 614. Usually during the first summer, students must find their own placements and they must be approved.	SU Semester 3 (or SP Semester 2)
SPED 796	Families and Professional Collaboration	2	All	It was 3 credit hours, so some POS might be 31 hours during the interim change.	FL Semester 4
SPED 614	ECU: Assessments and Methods: Infants, Toddlers and Families	3	Fall	B- or better	FL Semester 4
SPED 847P	ECU: Practicum and Field Experience, Preschool	3-4	All	Must be taken with or after SPED 617. Students teaching in this grade level can use the teaching position as their placement. When the teaching position is used, it should be the 4 hour option.	FL Semester 4 (or SU Semester 6)
SPED 847KG	ECU Practicum and Field Experience: K-3	3-4	All	Must be taken with or after SPED 703 or whatever is subbed for the course. If the teaching position is a K-3 or SPED only position, they can use it as their practicum placement. Otherwise I often suggest they begin looking for a summer ESY placement with their district in December.	

**Note:** Students are eligible to take Praxis exams for teacher licensure after completion of all of the above preparatory and required core courses and approval from faculty advisor.

**Note on Practicum hours:** Total hours must equal 10. It is recommended that you take your 4 hour practicum in the age-level with whom you work in your day-to-day position.
