The W. The instructor teaching load will be 4 courses (3-credit each) in fall semester and 4 courses in spring semester. The start date is August 8th, 2022. Potential candidates will teach undergraduate and graduate classes. BA and MIS instructors will teach Introduction to Business Analytics and Introduction to MIS courses, respectively. Candidates will primarily teach face to face but should be willing to teach using other instructional modalities (online, blended) and engage with the local businesses and the larger community to provide applied learning opportunities for the students. Candidates are expected to engage in different service activities at the department, college, university, profession, and local community.

The Barton School of Business works closely with the business community, which provides research opportunities for faculty and keeps our curriculum relevant.
