GUIDELINES FOR ADMINISTRATION OF THE JOHN AND ELIZABETH WEATHERBY SCHOLARSHIP/FELLOWSHIP

The John and Elizabeth Weatherby Scholarship/Fellowship fund has been established with contributions to the Wichita State University Foundation. These contributions and all subsequent additions to the fund shall be administered in accordance with the Donor's instructions as set forth in these Guidelines for Administration and the policies and procedures approved and adopted by the Board of Directors of the Wichita State University Foundation.

John Weatherby graduated from Wichita State University in May 1974, with an MBA degree. He is Senior Managing Director at Newmark Knight Frank, a commercial real estate firm in San Mateo, California. He earned his AB Degree in Political Science from Brown University in 1966. John served 7 years in the USAF, including duty as a Missile Crew Commander at the 381st Strategic Missile Wing at McConnell AFB, Wichita. Elizabeth is a retired nurse. They have one daughter, Diana.

All student support distributed from this fund will be applied to the purpose described below excepting any unforeseen future circumstances that result in a determination by the Foundation Board of Directors that the original purpose no longer best serves the interests of Wichita State University. Every effort will be made by the Foundation to contact the Donor or his/her designated representative(s) before any changes are made to these guidelines.

- 1. Scholarships and/or fellowships will be awarded annually to undergraduate and/or graduate students enrolled full or part time at Wichita State University in the W. Frank Barton School of Business and the College of Fine Arts.
- 2. No recipient will be excluded from consideration on the basis of age, ancestry, color, disability, gender, gender expression, gender identity, genetic information, marital status, national origin, political affiliation, pregnancy, race, religion, sex, sexual orientation, or status as a veteran.
- 3. Recipients must meet and maintain the academic eligibility criteria determined by their college.
- 4. Awards will be made with regard to financial need. Six (6) \$2,000.00 scholarships and/or fellowships will be awarded in the W. Frank Barton School of Business and four (4) \$2,000.00 scholarships and/or fellowships will be awarded in the College of Fine Arts.
- 5. Preference will be given to underrepresented minorities.
- 6. Within the W. Frank Barton School of Business, preference will be given to MBA and accounting students; within the College of Fine Arts, preference will be given to vocal performance and organ students.

- 7. The Scholarship Office of Wichita State University will administer the scholarships and/or fellowships and make the awards based on the recommendations submitted by the W. Frank Barton School of Business and the College of Fine Arts.
- 8. The scholarships and/or fellowships will not be renewed.

As is customary with universities and other non-profit organizations across the country, a one-time Foundation fee is applied to all gifts to provide essential support necessary for the WSU Foundation's overall operations.
