DEVELOPING THE DOCUMENTARY: DIRECTOR DR. KEVIN S. HARRISON REFLECTS ON THE HUMAN EXPERIENCE, DIFFERING PERSPECTIVES, AND HISTORY LESSONS IN THE SILENT CRIES OF UNBORN GHETTO CHILDREN

Join Dr. Kevin Sylvester Harrison and delve into the tragic 1965 plane crash in Wichita, where a KC-135 Air Force refueling tanker crashed into a neighborhood, killing 23 people on the ground and a crew of seven. Dr. Harrison, a native of Wichita, and assistant professor at Wichita State University's Cohen Honors College, is a creator, writer, and community advocate who co-produced this thought-provoking film with the support of Humanities Kansas. Beyond the historical account, the documentary goes deeper, exploring the trauma of the crash and the implications of segregation within Wichita's racially divided community in 1965. Dr. Harrison describes the documentary by saying, "It sheds light on the negligence of Boeing and the US Airforce, the issue of humiliating settlements, media bias and the human longing to be heard and understood." Through lectures, readings, and engaging discussions, you will reflect on the human experience, differing perspectives, and the lessons to be learned from history.
