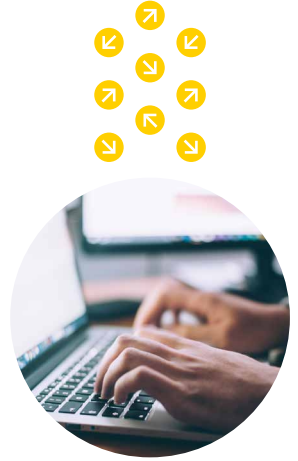

FLY FISHING: THE BASICS


