KANSAS IS NOT FLAT & BORING



On this trip, we will head to Northwest Kansas to view the Kansas Niobrara chalk formations, better known as Little Jerusalem and Monument Rocks. Our first stop is the canyons and pinnacles of Little Jerusalem in Logan County, which opened to the public in October 2019. You will have the opportunity to hike two permanent marked trails to view the rock formations that tower more than 100 feet. Along the way you can see fascinating plants and animals as well as the fossil remains of swimming and flying reptiles dating back 85 million years. The Overlook Trail extends one-quarter mile along a crushed rock surface to a scenic viewpoint. The terrain is loose rock surface with a gentle gradient. The Life on the Rocks Trail winds one-half mile along the rim of the rocks with multiple bends to provide a variety of views and two scenic overlooks. The trail is crushed rock surface and gentle gradients for all abilities for the first two-thirds mile (3,500 feet) to the first overlook; natural surface trail with moderate slopes for the next one-half mile (2,766 feet) to the second overlook. After a quick stop at Scott Lake, we will travel to Gove County and Monument Rocks. Known as the Chalk Pyramids, these majestic formations are considered one of the eight wonders of Kansas. MINING AND "THE MOTHER ROAD": A TOUR OF SOUTHEAST KANSAS' MOST ICONIC LANDMARKS

Join us for a nostalgic look at some of Southeast Kansas' most iconic landmarks. Our day begins with breakfast at the historic Beaumont Hotel. After breakfast, we continue southeast to the town of West Mineral where we will visit the Big Brutus visitor center and mining museum. It's then on to Route 66. The 13 miles of Route 66 is the shortest stretch of the iconic highway, but among the best preserved. Our first stop will be Cars on the Route, a restored Kan-O-Tex service station. Outside the building you will see the mining boom truck that inspired the character "Tow Mater" in Radiator Springs from the movie Cars. We continue on Route 66 to the town of Riverton and a stop at the Eisler Brother's Old Riverton Store for lunch. The store has been operating on Route 66 since before the Route officially opened. Our trip continues to Baxter Springs with stops at the Route 66 Visitors Center and the Baxter Springs Heritage Center and Museum where you will learn about the area's mining history as well as the history of Route 66. As we make our way back to Wichita, we will drive through Picher, Oklahoma, which was once a major national center of lead and zinc mining but is now a ghost town due to groundwater contamination and health effects of mining. We will also stop in Independence for dinner before we conclude our trip.

WIT AND WISDOM TOUR

Join us as we step back to a simpler time in American history as we explore Oklahoma's "Green Country." During our trip to Northeast Oklahoma, we will travel along historic Route 66 to our first stop at the Will Rogers Memorial museum. Will Rogers, one of the most famous actors and authors in the world during the 1920s and 30s, was born and lived in Claremore, Oklahoma. After exploring the museum, we take a short trip to Oologah, OK to visit Will Rogers birthplace where we will catch a glimpse at what life was like on a late nineteenth century ranch in Indian Territory. After lunch at the ranch, we will head to the J.M. Davis Arms & Historical Museum, the largest privately-held firearms collection in the world. The museum is home to over 12,000 firearms and thousands of non-firearm artifacts ranging from Old West saddles and spurs, John Rogers statuary, Toby mugs and Beer Steins, World War I posters and local Claremore and Rogers county history. Last, we venture on down the famous Route 66 where we will tour Ed Galloway's iconic Totem Pole Park, the oldest and largest example of a folk art environment in Oklahoma. Dinner will be provided.

BRIDGE OVER TROUBLED WATERS: 1970S AMERICA

If "the past is prologue," the 1970s have a lot to teach us about today's world. Often viewed as "our strangest decade," the seventies have been neglected as an interlude between the exciting days of the 1960s social reforms and overseas adventures and the conservative backlash of the 1980s. The decade that gave us the yellow smiley face, pet rocks, gas lines and the polyester leisure suit. In hindsight, however, many of today's forces and events in politics, economics, culture and environment are echoes of the 1970s. Overseas retrenchment in the aftermath of the Vietnam War, public distrust of core institutions after political corruption revealed by impeachment, economic insecurity and challenges from abroad, gun violence and crime in major cities, protests related to the rising tide of ethnic and gender equality, increasing awareness of environmental pollution effects and an extraordinary and unpredicted spiritual fundamentalism, among a great many other issues of the 1970s, provide context for contemporary circumstances. Join us as we engage in what promises to be a free- wheeling discussion of the issues of the 1970s and their relevance for today.
