Teamwork – A reliance upon the professionalism of our colleagues with acknowledgement that all are equally valued.

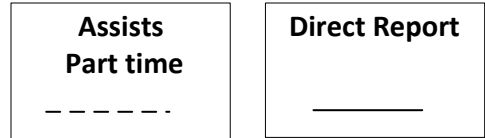
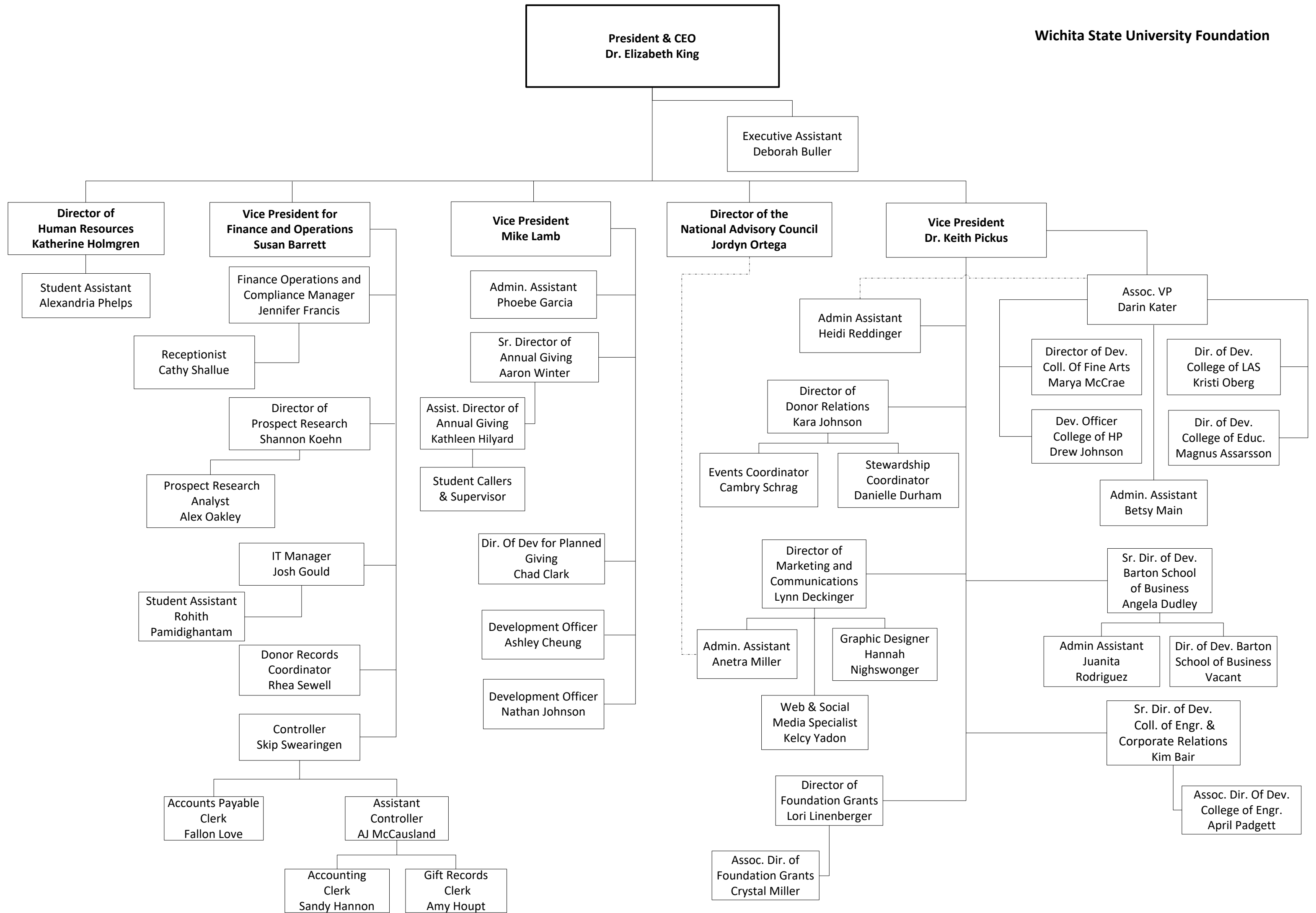
Relationships – A commitment to enhancing trust, respect and diversity.

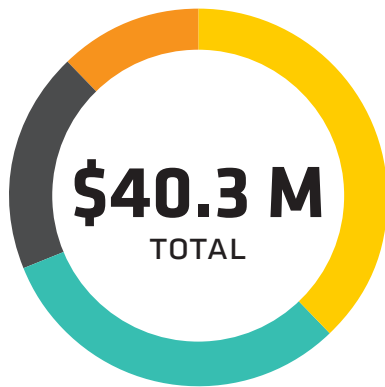

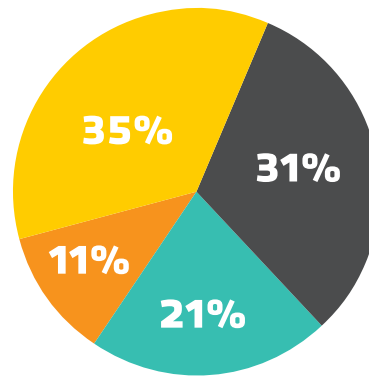

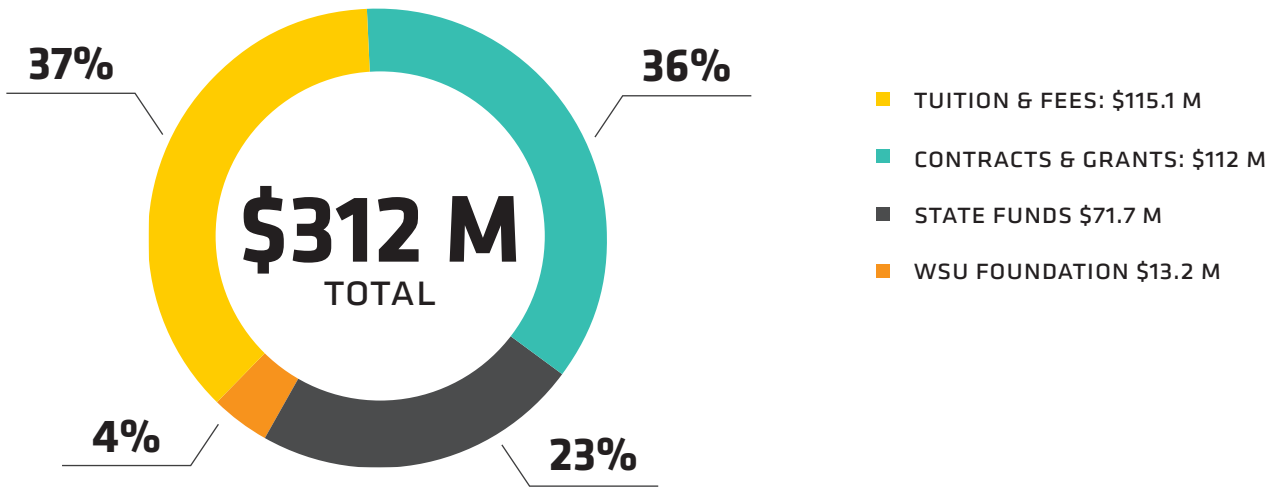

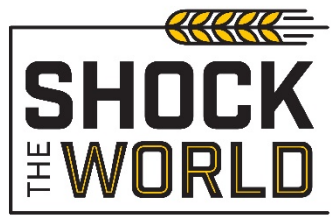

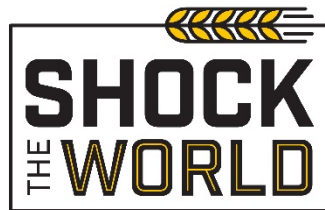
