**Subject:** RE: data on 'instructors' (i.e. adjuncts)

Adjuncts (which we call lecturers or LPs) are term based appointments but it is not unusual for them to have serial employment and that employment may include teaching in multiple departments and/or colleges for a given term or across terms. We normally average about 270 LPs per term (based on fall census terms). The mean number of class sections taught is 2 per term. For fall 2016 we had 267 of which 258 were graders, they generated 25,534 credit hours. Listed is the fall 2016 distribution.
