Auditors complete the following duties:

- Audit internal DCF programs and service contractors for compliance to policy and regulations;

- Analyze and summarize qualitative and quantitative information to answer defined objectives;
- Assist with writing audit reports.

Required and Preferred Qualifications

A bachelor’s degree in any discipline is required. Preferred qualifications include:

- A degree in business or public administration, economics, mathematics, political science, or other relevant discipline
- A graduate degree and/or six months to two years’ experience in an organizational setting
- Experience in auditing or program evaluation
