

Space Exploration Teacher Workshop



This summer Fairmount College of Liberal Arts and Sciences at Wichita State University is hosting a workshop for schoolteachers. Teachers will spend one day in sessions taught by WSU faculty about concepts related to space exploration and hearing about local resources available for use in classrooms. On the second day of the workshop, teachers will collaborate with each other to develop lessons and activities they can take back to their classrooms.

Who? Any K-12 Teacher (Target Range: 5th-8th Grade Teachers)

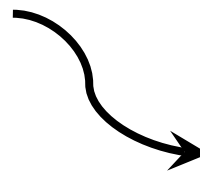
Cost? FREE

The days following the workshop, teachers have the option to apply and evaluate the activities they developed in a summer camp with students. Teachers who participate and lead activities in the summer camp will receive a stipend. The summer camp will include activities with students on July 14-15, then a field trip with the students on July 16.

Teachers also have the option to evaluate the lessons in their classrooms during the school year using a provided survey measuring student interests and aspirations in science. These survey results will be used in a study to evaluate the workshop and activities.
