WSU Policy on FS & I&P

Three courses required: one must be a Further Study (FS), one must be an Issues and Perspective (I&P), third course can be either. If a student takes two FS and one I&P, the two FS courses must be distributed over two divisions; if a student takes one FS and two I&P, the two I&P courses must be in at least two subject areas.

KBOR Policy

- 12 hours Foundation;
- 12 hours Fine Arts/Humanities in 3 disciplines;
- 12 hours Social and Behavioral Science in 3 disciplines;
- 9 hours Natural Science/Mathematics in 2 disciplines with Natural Science lab.
