

BFA in Graphic Design, 2019-20 (120 Hours) Suggested four-year plan of study.

Foundation classes (ARTF 102, 136, 145 and 189) must be completed before students can enroll in ARTF 202.

Two introductory Art History courses (ARTH 125A, 125B or 125C) and all introductory Graphic Design courses (ARTG 110, 111, 112, 216, 234 and 235) must be completed or in progress before enrolling in ARTF 202.

Gen Ed Intro courses listed below can be completed in any order, the order below is just a suggested distribution.

A grade of C (2.0 grade points) or better is required in all ADCI courses. Courses with a C- or lower will need to be repeated.

A minimum GPA of 2.000 is required within the major.

WSU requires a minimum of 45 hours of 300+ coursework from four-year institutions (no Community College courses count towards this total regardless of their course equivalency).

Application for graduation must be completed through your myWSU portal two semesters in advance of graduation date.

Eligibility for graduation is determined by Degree Works degree evaluation as verified by the School of Art, Design and Creative Industries Academic Advisor.
