7 different semesters of Symphonic Band (MusP 213B/413B) or Wind Ensemble (MusP 210B/410B). Plus one semester of an ensemble focusing on another musical genre (jazz, orchestra, choir, chamber, etc.)

STRING MAJORS
7 different semesters of Symphony Orchestra (MusP 211A/411A). Plus one semester of an ensemble focusing on another musical genre (jazz, orchestra, choir, chamber, etc.)

ELECTRIC BASS MAJORS
7 different semesters of appropriate large ensemble (MusP 211M/411M/ 211T/212T/411T/412T). Plus one semester of an ensemble focusing on another musical genre (jazz, orchestra, choir, chamber, etc.)

PIANO MAJORS
4 different semesters of Orchestra (MusP211A/411A), Symphonic Band (MusP 213B/413B), Wind Ensemble (MusP 210B/410B) or 4 different semesters of A Cappella Choir (MusP 212F/412F), Concert Chorale (MusP 213F/413F) plus 4 additional different semesters of Piano Accompanying (MusP 211J/411J).

TRANSFER STUDENTS
8 different semesters of Symphonic Band (MusP 213B/413B) or Wind Ensemble (MusP 210B/410B) or Orchestra (MusP 211A/411A) including 4 different semesters of WSU Wind Ensemble (MusP 410B) or Symphonic Band (MusP 413B). WSU Policy on FS & I&P

Three courses required: one must be a Further Study (FS), one must be an Issues and Perspective (I&P), third course can be either. If a student takes two FS and one I&P, the two FS courses must be distributed over two divisions; if a student takes one FS and two I&P, the two I&P courses must be in at least two subject areas.

KBOR Policy
