This composition is a very traditional and characteristic presentation in the Indian classical dance form of Kathak called 'Raas'. The lyrics portray the situations, episodes of the Hindu God Krishna's legends and the tales of him playing, dancing and growing up together with Radha, his favorite milk maiden from his childhood in the village of Vrindavan. The classical music of this piece is composed by the late legendary Kathak maestro, Pandit Birju Maharaj Ji. The choreography combines elements of grace with exquisite, powerful rhythmic footwork patterns set to the 16-beat musical meter of Teentaal.

Kalakrit School of Art (4/27) Ghoomar

Goomar is a traditional folk dance of the state of Rajasthan in India, traditionally performed by women and based on the word 'ghoomna' meaning twirling around oneself. This popular song from Hindi cinema was labeled 'song of the year' in India. This dance presentation effortlessly blends the traditional Kathak repertoire with upbeat rhythms of Rajasthani folklore creating a harmonious fusion and an enchanting experience for the viewers. The vocals are by Shreya Ghoshal and Swaroop Singh, and the song is part of the Padmavat movie soundtrack.

Aviance Battles (Rehearsal Director of "Clear Elevation") Kansas City, KS native Aviance Battles is an independent artist, dancer, collaborator, teacher, and choreographer, who started her dance journey at 6 years old. After graduating from her hometown dance studio, Creative Movements in 2016, she attended Wichita State University with a full-ride scholarship, where she trained in Lester Horton modern and Vaganova Ballet techniques for 4 years, and performed in works choreographed by Darrell Grand Moultrie, Charlotte Boye-Christensen, Jammie Walker of Mark Morris Dance Company, Mary Lynn Graves of Ririe-Woodbury Dance Company, Sabrina Vasquez, Cheyla Clawson, Denise Celestin, and Nick Johnson. Ms. Battles graduated summa cum laude in 2020 with her Bachelor of Fine Arts in Performing Arts with an emphasis in Performance Dance with a modern dance focus. During her summers, she also worked closely with Urban Bush Women from NYC and Dallas Black Dance Theatre to further her training. Aviance joined the Regina Klenjoski Dance Company in 2019 and has since professionally performed in works choreographed by Natasha Adorlee, Kia Smith, Caroline Dahm, Gary Abbott and Tristian Griffin. Aviance is also currently living in Wichita as a hip-hop, Jazz, and modern dance teacher, a GYROTONIC® instructor, a Recruitment Specialist for the School of Performing Arts at Wichita State University and performs and creates within the Wichita artist community any chance she gets.



Denise Celestin (Choreographer of "Café Noir") is a Professor of Ballet at Wichita State University. She received her early ballet training in New Orleans and the Bachelor of Fine Arts/Master of Fine Arts in Ballet from Texas Christian University. She performed with the New Orleans Ballet, Fort Worth Ballet and BalletMet Columbus. Ms. Celestin has participated as a coach in the USA International Ballet Competition, and she has choreographed a wide range of works for Ballet and Opera, many of which have been presented on tours throughout Europe, in Taiwan and Mexico. Awards received include the Kansas Arts Commission Individual Artist Fellowship for Choreography, the WSU College of Fine Arts Excellence in Creative Activity and Excellence in Teaching Awards, the WSU President's Award for Distinguished Service, and the Dorothy Johansen Hauck Faculty Fellowship in Dance. Her special interest in music and dance has led to presentations on historical dances with her colleague Dr. Sylvia Coats, at numerous national and international music conferences. Well versed in all styles of ballet, she has a particular love for Russian ballet style and aesthetics, and has studied teaching methods at the International Vaganova Method Conference in St. Petersburg, Russia, in addition to studies with teachers in the U.S and Canada.

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Chevla Clawson, MA, MFA (Director of SPA/Artistic Director/Producer) is an Associate Professor of Dance and the Director of the School of Performing Arts at Wichita State University. Chandler's modern dance research is focused on Horton Technique, and she attended the Horton Dance Technique Certificate Program 2013-2020 at The Ailey School in New York City. Her two duets, Anam Chara (2014) and nosuchSymbiosis (2016) were invited to The American College Dance Association National Festival at The Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. Cheyla presented her latest research focused on community integration curriculum in dance performance degrees at The International Arts in Society conference in June 2022 (Australia), gave a workshop on Dance and Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion for the American College Dance Association online National Workshop series in March of 2021 as well as community-based intergenerational research at The American Dance Symposium in NYC in January of 2023. At WSU, Cheyla is a member of the Student Success and Persistence Coalition, the President's President's Inclusive Excellence Council and the University Assessment Committee.



Michael Cole (*Lighting Designer*) After working as a Lighting Director and a Lighting Designer in 2021 and 2022, Michael has relocated from New York City to join the staff of Music Theatre Wichita. Originally from Dallas, Texas, Michael began working in theatre in 1995 as a performer and transitioned to design work while in college. He attended The University of Oklahoma and received two Bachelor of Fine Arts in Musical Theatre Performance (2009) and Lighting Design (2011). Since college, he has worked internationally in dance, opera, musical theatre, corporate events, and more. His credits include productions on Broadway, Off-Broadway, international tours, and regional theatre across the USA.

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Mina Estrada (Director) commits a substantial amount of time to teaching, creating, and facilitating some kind of dance experience for herself and those who care to join. She received her Master of Fine Arts in Dance at Temple University, and her choreography and workshops, which are rooted in contemporary movement concepts and improvisation, have been commissioned by several college, high school and studio dance programs, and professional companies including Spelman College, Grand Valley State University, Baton Rouge Ballet Theatre, and Todd Rosenlieb Dance. Mina has served as faculty for the dance programs at Temple University, Old Dominion University, Christopher Newport University, and Drexel University, among others. While teaching and choreographing at Drexel, Mina also served as the Dance Departments concert producer and assistant director of the FreshDance Ensemble. She is often producing shows in collaboration with other artists and contributing dance works in festivals around the country. While in Philadelphia, she performed in the Live Arts Festival, Philly Fringe Festival, and Collage Festival, received the New Edge Residency at the CEC, worked with notable artists Jumatatu Poe, Silvana Cardell, Shavon Norris, and Leah Stein Dance Company. Transitioning to the South, Mina served as Director of Artist Resources for the Arts Council of Greater Baton Rouge, served as faculty at Louisiana State University, produced shows and other dance experiences with CoCo Loupe via their company CKA: currently known as, and began creating intergenerational dances and movement workshops for folks living with dementia and Alzheimer's. For the past 5 years Mina has been traveling to Austin, TX to study intensively with postmodern maven Deborah Hay to fortify her experimental performance practice. Currently, she is teaching at Wichita State University, serves as co-creator of Benevolent Instruction (creative modality and podcast), and is Managing Director of Harvester Arts. Mina continues to make community building a priority with Smack Dab Dance Lab, which creates opportunities for local choreographers and dancers to experiment, play, commune, and share their work. When she is not busy making dance stuffs, Mina continues to be in hot pursuit of great storytellers, generous muses, equilibrium, and more time to pet her cats, smile at her husband, and hang out with Mother Nature.

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Sarah Knapp (Choreographer of "Something Like Grief") began her dance training at Kansas Dance Academy. She attended various summer ballet programs and received her Bachelor of Fine Arts from the University of Missouri-Kansas City. Throughout college, Sarah performed and assistant taught all over the United States and abroad, most notably at the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C., and in China, Canada, Thailand, Costa Rica, and Australia. During her sophomore year, she starred in the 2015 feature film, *Lift Me Up*. As a company member with Wylliams Henry Contemporary Dance Company, Sarah performed several Kansas City seasons and toured to Florida, North Carolina, and Jacob's Pillow in Becket, MA to perform on the iconic Inside Out Stage in 2018. That same summer, a few weeks prior, Sarah participated in Jacob's Pillow's first ever Gaga Intensive, where she studied under Brett Easterling and Ohad Naharin. After a year of further study and performance in New York City, Sarah returned home to Wichita and began focusing on her own work and local dance. She produced Expectation, an evening length solo work in Kansas City's Fringe Festival, summer 2019, and performed with Regina Klenjoski Dance Company for 2 seasons. Sarah was privileged to be an artist in Cheyla Clawson's dance film She Moved the Prairie in the Fall of 2020. She was married to Patrick Knapp in 2021 and they have two children, Cora and William. She is so grateful to present her work, Something Like Grief, here at Wichita State this Spring.



Emma Lewis (*Costume Designer of "Stim-U Rots"*) is a senior pursuing a BA in Theatre at Wichita State University, with a certificate in Film Studies. She is also a member of the Honors College and works in the costume shop on campus. She is a costume designer from Denver, Colorado. Emma has previously worked on *The Scarlet Letter* (Wardrobe Crew), Stupid *Fucking Bird* (Wardrobe Supervisor), *Wichita Contemporary Dance Theatre Spring Concert* (Costume Designer), for the dance piece *seenUnseen*, *Mama Bushwick is Dead* (Costume/ Hair and Makeup Designer), *A Chorus Line* (Hair and Makeup Supervisor), and *Twelfth Night* (Assistant Costume/Hair/Makeup Designer). Emma has also interned with Music Theatre Wichita in the costume department for the musical *Cats* and just finished her first contract with Celebrity Cruises this past summer as a Wardrobe Stitcher. She is excited to finish her senior year working on the dance concert and returning to Celebrity Cruises after graduation.

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Sheldon Mba (Choreographer of "Stim-U Rots") is an Assistant Professor of Performing Arts and the Program Director of Theatre at Wichita State University. He has professionally performed regionally in the Midwest and Southeast as an actor and concert dancer. Mba has performed brilliantly as an actor in a wide range of roles, such as Peter in Jesus Christ Superstar (Summer Lyric at Tulane), Laertes in Hamlet (New Orleans Shakespeare), Little Moe in Five Guys Named Moe (Forum Theatre), Brad in Rocky Horror (Crown Arts Collaborative and Sheldon Saperstein in The Prom (Oklahoma Lyric). As a dancer, he has shared his skills with the Koffee Dance Company, the African American Dance Ensemble, Harambee Collective, the Regina Klenjoski Dance Company, and Smack Dab Dance Lab. The Region V Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival recognized him for his Choreography of Catch Me If You Can and Little Women. His Direction and Choreography Credits include American Dance Festival, National Black Theatre Festival, Region IV of KCACTF, Crown Arts Collaborative, Forum Theatre, Roxy's Downtown Theatre, Children's Performance Theatre, Wichita Collegiate High School, Trinity Academy, Harvester Arts, and in numerous capacities across the Midwest and East coast.

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Darrell Grand Moultrie (*Featured Choreographer of "Clear Elevation"*) is a recipient of the Princess Grace Choreography Fellowship Award, Darrell Grand Moultrie has established himself as one of the most diverse and sought-after choreographers and master teachers.

Moultrie has created and staged works for dance companies across the world including American Ballet Theatre, The Alvin Ailey American Dance Theatre, Dance Theatre of Harlem, Hubbard Street Dance Chicago, BalletX, Atlanta Ballet, Milwaukee Ballet Colorado Ballet, Cincinnati Ballet, BalletMet Columbus, Ailey 2, Tulsa Ballet, Richmond Ballet, Smuin Ballet, Sacramento Ballet, Grand Rapids Ballet, The Juilliard School, North Carolina Dance Theatre, Cleo Parker Robinson Dance Ensemble, and NBA Ballet in Japan among others.

Moultrie served as the choreographer for the Pulitzer Prize Winning & 2023 Tony Nominated Play FAT HAM. His work can currently be seen in Disney's new revival of the Tony Award winning musical AIDA, currently playing The Netherlands. For his work, he received a "Best Choreography" nomination at the Netherland's Musical Awards. Additional credits include the world premiere of the new musical, GODDESS, at Berkeley Repertory Theatre directed by Tony Nominee Saheem Ali, MCC's SPACE DOGS, The Public Theater's Shakespeare in the Park production of MERRY WIVES, the world premiere of Jeremy O. Harris's off-Broadway play DADDY, WITNESS UGANDA at American Repertory Theater directed by Tony Winner Diane Paulus, SUGAR IN OUR WOUNDS at Manhattan Theatre Club, the off-Broadway musical INVISIBLE THREAD at Second Stage, the world premiere of REDWOOD at Portland Center Stage Theater, and EVITA and PRIDE & PREJUDICE at Kansas City Repertory Theatre. Moultrie has collaborated with Tony Award-winning dancer Savion Glover and choreographed EL PUBLICO, a new opera at the world famous Teatro Real in Madrid, Spain directed by Robert Castro and Conducted by Robert Heras-Casado. Darrell served as a choreographer on Beyonce's record breaking tour, the Mrs. Carter World Tour. Moultrie is a proud New Yorker, born and raised in Harlem, and a graduate of Laguardia High School and The Juilliard School.



Lille Nightingale (*Choreographer of "Lord Have Mercy"*) is a senior pursuing a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Performing Arts with an emphasis in Dance . She is also working on her minor in sustainability and a certificate in environment and sustainability.
