Fill Your Portfolio

Students must collect 10 points to fill their portfolio. Evidence of completion includes "artifacts" and written entry for each activity. Artifact examples include:

- Pictures while involved in the activity
- Documentation by the activity directors (i.e., volunteer coordinator, manager, etc.)
- Completed course assignments
- Certificates of completion
- Email confirmations

Written entry for each activity is to be approximately 250 words and must demonstrate the connection between the activity and at minimum one (1) of the Health Management program learning outcomes below:

apply a broad-based understanding of biological, medical, and social knowledge to solve healthcare issues

Evidence-Based Practice:

demonstrate skill in using data to analyze and improve health outcomes

Health Administration:

understand U.S. healthcare system deliver, management, and operations

understand the protection, promotion, and assurance of population health outcomes

Equity and Ethics:

demonstrate commitment to culturally informed healthcare ethics and equity

Interprofessionalism:

demonstrate commitment to communication cooperation, professionalism, and personcentered care
