- Earn credit in a minimum of 60 hours at a 4-year institution.

- Maintain an overall and WSU GPA of 2.00 or higher.
- Maintain a program GPA of 2.5 or higher.
- At least 24 of last 30 or 50 of last 60 credit hours must be completed at WSU.
