- Figures are estimates given by Host University. Figures were given in host currency and converted to United States Dollars using a floating exchange rate.
As of 06/27/20, 1 Japanese Yen (JPY) = 0.0094 USD
- Accommodations are given at 104,800 yen per month in a dormitory style living, which includes utilities, WIFI, and 2 meals a day on the weekdays. **Total accommodation fees must be paid approximately three months prior to the start of the semester.**
- Extra meals are calculated for a total of 11 meals per week at \$5 (539 yen) per meal.
- Books/study materials are budgeted for 60,000 yen per semester.
- Local transportation within Tokyo to and from the university. The commuting pass is accounted for 35,000 yen per semester.
- The LewerMark Student Insurance Silver Plan is required for international travel. The total cost is based on the total number of days the student is abroad. Currently, it costs \$1.10 per day plus \$10 administrative fee so 150 days will be \$175.
- For Aoyama Gakuin University, international students are required to participate in the National Health Insurance (NHI) Program. The monthly premium is approximately 2,000 yen. National Health Insurance covers 70 percent of your medical expenses and you pay the remainder (30 percent).
- US citizens are exempt from visa fees.
- Airfare cost was provided as an average (Orbitz, STA travel, Expedia) with travel dates of January 20, 2021 – June 6, 2021. This should provide a good estimate to cover the airfare expense.
- Personal expense estimates are provided by Financial Aid for students living on the WSU campus, which will be similar during a study abroad program.

*** Tuition and Fees are based on the Resident rate for 12 undergraduate credit hours at Wichita State University. Students will pay their current tuition rate during the study abroad program based on their residency and any specific college/department requirements such as the business & engineering fees.**

Disclaimer: All costs are estimates and subject to change. Some universities will require payment for accommodations in advance as well as other fees. In order to apply for visas, students may be required to show proof of funds, such as bank statements, to live in a host country. Please note extra travel expenses are not included. Budget accordingly.
