NOTES: All fees are based on a 5 month period for a fall or spring semester.

- Figures are estimates given by Host University. Figures were given in host currency and converted to United States Dollars using a floating exchange rate.  
As of 6/27/20, 1 Korean Won (KRW) = 0.00084 (USD)
- Exchange students are required to live on campus in the dormitories during their time at Dankook. Accommodations are budgeted at a total of 1,320,000 won per semester, which includes a 20,000 cleaning fee.
- Estimate for meals was given by Dankook University.
- Dankook offers a free shuttle system around campus. Estimated cost for other transportation around the city was given by Dankook University.
- No exact estimate was provided by the partner university; however, we estimate that you should not spend over \$150 for textbooks for one semester.
- The LewerMark Student Insurance Silver Plan is required for international travel. The total cost is based on the total number of days the student is abroad. Currently, it costs \$1.10 per day plus \$10 administrative fee so 150 days will be \$175.
- A Student Visa is required in Korea for those who wish to study. Visas can be requested by mail or by personal appearance at the Chicago consulate. **This is not included in this budget.** The Visa fee is \$66.55.
- Airfare cost was provided as an average (Orbitz, STA travel, Expedia) with travel dates of January 20, 2021- June 6, 2021. This should provide a good estimate to cover the airfare expense.
- Students are also required to submit proof of an authorized tuberculosis test result that is taken within 45 days prior to their arrival in Korea. **This is not included in this budget.**
- Personal expense estimates are provided by Financial Aid for students living on the WSU campus, which will be similar during a study abroad program.

**\* Tuition and Fees are based on the Resident rate for 12 undergraduate credit hours at Wichita State University. Students will pay their current tuition rate during the study abroad program based on their residency and any specific college/department requirements such as the business & engineering fees.**

**Disclaimer: All costs are estimates and subject to change. Some universities will require payment for accommodations in advance as well as other fees. In order to apply for visas, students may be required to show proof of funds, such as bank statements, to live in a host country. Please note extra travel expenses are not included. Budget accordingly.**
