## Finance & Taxation

**SB 23:** Enacting the Kansas sports wagering act.

**SB 73:** Amortizing the state and school KPERS actuarial accrued liability over a 30-year period and eliminating certain level-dollar employer contribution payments.

**SB 74:** Providing a post-retirement benefit increase (COLA) for certain KPERS retirees.

**SB 90:** Extending the tax credit under the center for entrepreneurship act to financial institutions and increasing the annual tax credit limit for all contributors.

**SB 91:** Establishing the golden years homestead property tax freeze act providing refund for certain increases in residential property taxes and allowing homestead property tax refund for renters.

**HB 2002:** Limiting the property tax exemption for fire districts.

**HB 2030:** Expanding eligibility for medicaid benefits to the extent permitted by the affordable care act.

**HB 2032:** Requiring that sports gaming be operated and managed solely by racetrack gaming facilities.

**HB 2037:** Relating to the veterans benefit lottery games, creating the veterans benefit lottery game fund and transferring moneys to veterans service programs.

**HB 2040:** Providing sales tax authority for Finney county.

**HB 2043:** Review of tax credits, tax exemptions and economic development programs.

**HB 2063:** Tax lid exemption when taxing entity abolished and duties assumed by a city or county.

**HB 2068:** Creating the Kansas sports wagering act.

## Public Safety

**SB 46:** Creating a procedure for owner to recover misappropriated property from pawnbroker or precious medal dealer.

**SB 62:** Allowing police vehicle drivers to engage in certain actions without using audible and visual signals.

**SB 63:** Allowing cities to authorize the use of transportation network company signs in vehicles.

**SB 79:** Modifying left turn lane traffic requirements.

**SB 81:** Changing penalties for crimes related to motor vehicles.

**SB 87:** Allowing certain persons with suspended drivers' licenses to enter into amnesty agreements with the district court.

**HB 2035:** Providing uniformity in the issuance of citations for violations of the Kansas cereal malt beverage act by ABC.

**HB 2036:** Repeal of prohibition on use of state appropriated moneys to lobby on gun control issues.

**HB 2049:** Increasing felony loss thresholds for certain property crimes.:

**HB 2064:** Clarifying that a law enforcement officer taking a person before a judge for violating the uniform act regulating traffic does not make charging decisions.

**HB 2065:** Removing the duty of the driver of an authorized emergency vehicle to drive with due regard for the safety of all others.

**HB 2084:** Amending the Kansas 911 act.

**HB 2088:** Creating the negligent driving violation.

**HB 2104:** Amendments related to driving under the influence, including preliminary screening tests, implied consent advisories and test refusal.

## Infrastructure

**SB 68:** Prohibiting cities from requiring a valid contract franchise ordinance for the provision of wireless telecommunications services.

**SB 69:** Requiring the state corporation commission to study electric rates and consider certain factors

in establishing just and reasonable electric rates.

## Human Resources

**SB 15:** Amending the definition of "service-connected" in the Kansas police and firemen's retirement system.

**SB 31:** Exempting certain association health plans from requirements pertaining to small employer health plans.

**SB 34:** Exempting health plans issued to associations of small employers from certain statutory provisions governing small employer health plans.

**SB 45:** Enhancing penalties for offenses causing death or serious bodily injury to public safety sector employees.

**SB 54:** Establishing the KanCare bridge to a healthy Kansas program.

**SB 84:** Amending the Kansas act against discrimination to include sexual orientation and gender identity or expression.

**SB 92:** Workers compensation impairment determination; use of AMA guidelines.

**HB 2012:** Replacing the workers compensation prevailing factor standard with a substantial factor standard.

**HB 2013:** Amending the edition of the AMA medical guide used to determine impairment for awarding workers compensation benefits.

**HB 2014:** Amending the disallowance of workers compensation benefits for fighting or horseplay when not work related.

**HB 2016:** Allowing injured workers who are receiving their social security benefits to keep the full amount of their workers compensation.

**HB 2022:** Enacting the Kansas working families pay raise act.

**HB 2031:** Amending the definition of "service-connected" in the Kansas police and firemen's retirement system.

**HB 2060:** Repealing prohibition on municipal regulation of paid leave for employees.

**HB 2061:** Repealing prohibition on municipal regulation of minimum wages.

**HB 2102:** Establishing the KanCare bridge to a healthy Kansas program.

**SB 58:** Granting immunity from civil liability to the person who files a grand jury petition.

**SB 59:** Eudora Community library district act.

**SB 65:** Requiring the attorney general to carry out certain duties related to investigating corruption committed by a public officer or public employee.

**SB 105:** Elections; cities; date for taking office.

**HB 2006:** Requiring the department of commerce to create a database of economic development incentive program information.
