

AS KANSAS' ONLY RESEARCH UNIVERSITY IN AN URBAN SETTING,

WSU can offer experiences others can't – *it's what separates Wichita State from the other guys*. By combining a traditional college atmosphere with the endless possibilities of the state's largest city, Wichita State University is the only school in Kansas that can provide an educational experience that goes beyond the limits of a typical college town. Because we are in Wichita, WSU students have advantages other students don't. **PERIOD.**



When Wichita State first opened its doors in 1895 students rode horses to class, telegraph machines were cutting-edge technology and Wichita had only been a city for roughly 25 years.

A LOT HAS CHANGED.

The past century has featured a remarkable evolution for Wichita State, one in which the school has grown from a small Christian college to a large state university – punctuated by two name changes and a few thousand extra students.

Together with the city of Wichita, WSU has built one of the most unique partnerships in Kansas, one that over the years has propelled each to new heights. It's a relationship that both supplies the lifeblood of a thriving community and makes it possible to provide the most well-rounded education in the region.

Today, the university continues to change to reflect the world around it, finding new ways to keep future generations of Shockers one step ahead of the competition.

WICHITA IS NOT YOUR TYPICAL COLLEGE TOWN.

As the medical, communications, financial and entertainment hub of Kansas, Wichita can make living in a runof-the-mill college town seem a little lacking. From huge annual festivals and serene nature preserves to worldclass dining and a thriving arts community, Wichita has it all. Combine that with practically endless opportunities for on-the-job experience as well as easy access to industry experts, and Wichita is a virtual utopia for the aspiring college student.

THE CITY OF WICHITA OFFERS MANY ENTERTAINMENT OPPORTUNITIES.

Wichita's Old Town neighborhood is nestled in the heart of the city and features more than 100 restaurants, shops, clubs, theaters, galleries and museums which are sure to offer fun to visitors of all ages. On the final Friday of each month many art galleries, museums and retail shops display art exhibits from local artists which are free and open to the public. Intrust Bank Arena is the main concert venue downtown with performers like Twenty One Pilots, Taylor Swift, Dave Matthews Band, Lil Wayne, Ariana Grande and Cirque du Soleil, gracing the stage.

SHOCKER RECRUITMENT OPPORTUNITIES

There are numerous ways to get involved as an Alumni Student Recruiter. College fairs and local programming are just a couple of ways to help recruit prospective WSU students in your area. A Shocker Recruiter assists the Office of Admissions by representing Wichita State at various recruitment events and activities, and by identifying and maintaining contact with prospective students from the geographic area and community.

INFORMAL REPRESENTATION

You can be just as effective by doing informal recruitment as you can by helping out at formal recruitment opportunities! Some of the best interactions with students and parents are informal - with people you know



in your community, at work, at school, etc. You can assist WSU simply by serving as a resource in your area and by being a positive ambassador for WSU on a regular basis.

ATTENDING A COLLEGE FAIR

One very valuable service provided by the Shocker Recruitment Network is assisting members of the WSU Admissions staff at college fairs, or representing WSU at college fairs that a member of the WSU Admissions staff cannot attend. These fairs are designed to give prospective students and families a chance to gather literature about many colleges and speak to admissions representatives in a single evening program. Fairs are usually large two-hour functions held at a high school or community center. Each institution is assigned a table where a representative stands to answer questions and display information.

SHARE WHAT IS HAPPENING IN YOUR COMMUNITY

Shocker Recruitment Network partners are encouraged to identify prospective students in their community by sending names and addresses to the Office of Admissions. Send a link from your local newspaper, tv news, or other source to Elisha Satterfield at elisha. satterfield@wichita.edu. You may learn of these names from casual conversations at work or from clipping articles from the local newspaper. Share these names with us at wichita.edu/referashocker.

Also, high school guidance counselors can be contacted to learn the dates of important college fairs and other recruitment events. Volunteers should forward this information to Elisha Satterfield at elisha.satterfield@wichita.edu. If the Office of Admissions believes that a certain event is worth attending, we will do it. Sometimes we do not attend fairs because of costs, but there are other ways to help with recruiting in your community!



RECRUITER RESOURCES

PREPARATION


Invitations to college fairs must come to the Office of Admissions. The Assistant Director will arrange for coverage and will respond to the fair host. You will receive a copy of the invitation, along with other necessary information.

- Mark the date on your calendar.
- Receive materials (brochures, table banner, etc.) for college fair from the Office of Admissions
- Read all of the information carefully. It is important to review the Shocker Recruitment Network Handbook and the recent admissions materials. It is our goal to provide accurate information so that the students and their families will be able to make an informed decision about which college or university to attend.



COLLEGE FAIR ARRIVAL AND SET-UP

- Plan to arrive at least 30 minutes before the program starts. Read travel directions provided by the school, and remember that parking can be challenging at times. Check in when you arrive, and locate the assigned WSU table.
- Neat, professional dress [black or Wichita State colors] should be worn. Comfortable shoes will prevent aching feet later!
- Stand behind your table, even if a chair is provided, to advertise approachability. Per fair regulations, it is often required/expected to remain behind the table.
- Most college fairs are an open "shopper" format. Tables are set up in a large area (often a gymnasium) and students and parents move from table to table to obtain brochures, complete contact cards, and ask questions. As you arrange your display table, remember to leave space for students to complete contact cards.



QUESTIONS FOR PROSPECTIVE STUDENTS

You may ask students a question to help initiate a dialogue.

- What made you consider Wichita State?
- · What are you interested in studying?
- What concerns do you have about Wichita State?
- Have you ever visited the campus?
- What other colleges and universities are you considering?
- What are you looking for in a college?
- · What do you do in high school now?



WHEN RECRUITING, PLEASE DO...

- Be friendly, attentive, and smile
- Establish eye contact
- Stay at your assigned table for the duration of the program
- Convey your enthusiasm for WSU
- Emphasize the preparation it provided for your life right now
- Understand that you represent WSU to the students and families
- Know the basics (admissions requirements, costs, facts)
- Follow up if you say you will get back to someone
- Stay focused on their interests and answer questions accordingly
- Kindly acknowledge families waiting until you are able to speak with them
- · Be honest and accurate
- Make each person attending feel important
- Promote an official campus visit (wichita.edu/visit)
- Take a self or photo! We often use these to showecase what our staff and alumni are doing to help with recruitment.
- Have fun!





FACING THE "TOUGH" QUESTIONS

You may receive economic, social, or even political questions pertaining to the university. These could be similar to:

- How is WSU funding all of the new projects on the Innovation Campus?
- Why did Wichita State increase the fees for students?
- I heard parking is a nightmare on campus. Why don't they address that problem before adding a new building?
- Wichita State seems to be located in a rough neighborhood. Is it really safe to be sending my student to WSU?

Please be sensitive to these questions, and assure families that their student's best interest is our top priority. There are multiple resources the public can access to gain information regarding WSU's growth and development, safety, parking accommodations, and other tough topics. Direct them to wichita.edu or to the Office of Strategic Communications.

REMEMBER...

- Don't be afraid to say you don't know the answer to a question.

 Simply get their contact information and share with Elisha Satterfield. Admissions will follow up with the student or parent.
- Don't guarantee admission.

Inform them that a decision letter will be mailed within six weeks after submission of application and supporting documents.

- Don't use a student's academic record as an example, as admissions information must remain confidential. Instead, speak to your personal experience as a student or community supporter.
- **Don't answer inquiries related to our NCAA athletic programs.**Encourage them to discuss athletic opportunities at Wichita State with their current coach or direct them to **goshockers.com.**
- Don't make promises to students regarding giveaways, athletic tickets or any other monetary incentive.

 Encourage the student to sign up for a campus visit, where they will receive a free Shocker t-shirt!
- Don't elevate scholarships within discussion to a point of creating false hope for the student.

 Remind families that upon admission to Wichita State, students are automatically considered for Freshmen Merit scholarships based on high school academic performance and test scores.
- Don't stretch the truth or oversell the university.

 There are plenty of exciting things happening on campus to talk about, so there is no need to create false information.
- Don't steal students from other tables.

 Stand behind your table, to advertise approachability.
- Don't say negative things about other institutions.

 Discuss WSU's strengths, not other schools' perceived weaknesses.

QUESTIONS YOU SHOULDN'T ASK

Often, we need to ask pointed questions to best serve the student, but refrain from asking:

- Are you on free or reduced lunch?
- Why would you major in that?
- Do you really think you're cut out for college?
- Why would you go to a community college?
- Are you an undocumented student?
- What is your family's income level?



PACKING MATERIALS AND EVENT DEPARTURE

- We prefer that our representatives stay until the completion of the program, even if other representatives working around you leave before the designated time.
- Pack all materials into supplied boxes for shipping--consolidate as best you can.
- Complete event evaluation, if provided. There is also a WSU evaluation, provided in your packet, to be completed.
- Thank the host school. It is appropriate to leave the high school extra brochures.

WRAP-UP CHECKLIST

- Return the banner and all unused materials in the original box with the shipping label provided immediately.
- Include the completed WSU activity follow-up evaluation and any other input you may have.
- It is important to do this right away, as we need the materials for other events.
- Provide feedback to our office regarding your experience with recruitment materials and activities.
- THANK YOU for your time, energy, and enthusiasm!

RESEARCH AT WSU

With yearly **FUNDING TOPPING \$50 MILLION**, research at Wichita State ranges from bioscience, chemistry and engineering to mathematics, physics and ancient civilization.

In addition to excellent research within our academic departments, WSU is home to **MORE THAN 30 RESEARCH CENTERS AND INSTITUTES**, many of which work closely with local, regional and national entities to accelerate discovery and bring new products to the marketplace.

Wichita State consistently ranks **FIRST AMONG THE NATION'S UNIVERSITIES IN INDUSTRY- FUNDED AEROSPACE ENGINEERING RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT** expenditures, according to newly released National Science Foundation data. Wichita State also received \$5 million from federal agencies such as the Department of Defense, Federal Aviation Administration and NASA.



ESOURCES

Academic support, as well as resources to maintain physical and mental wellness, are available to all WSU students.

ACADEMIC ADVISING is available to all students and majors to help keep you on track toward graduation. Your academic advisor is available to help you plan your course of study, ease your college transition and offer counsel when you have academic difficulty.

WSU's **WRITING CENTER** offers free tutoring to students at every level and in all majors. Tutors offer assistance with all aspects of writing including brainstorming, organization, style and revision.

Free tutoring in the MATH LAB is available to students studying everything from algebra to statistics. The lab is open Monday-Friday with tutoring available on a drop-in basis.

The CENTER FOR EXCELLENCE IN ORAL COMMUNICATION opened in Spring 2017 and serves to grow students, faculty, staff and community members with their speaking abilities. The Center allows students to meet one-on-one with an instructor to help outline and present a speech.

PREPARING JOB PLACEMENT & CAREER DEVELOPMENT

Wichita State is the only university in Kansas to offer **COOPERATIVE EDUCATION, INTERNSHIPS** and **CAREER DEVELOPMENT** for most majors. These programs offer students the opportunity to gain work experiences that are directly related to their major or career interests. The Career Development Center at Wichita State is the go-to resource for anyone looking to build a bright future after college.





OFFICE OF DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

The Office of Diversity and Inclusion takes pride in creating and maintaining connections with various communities outside of campus and within Wichita State. Over the last school year, the Office of Diversity and Inclusion has been involved with over 100 events both in and outside of the community. Through programs, such as the MULTICULTURAL STUDENT MENTORING PROGRAM and the Ambassadors for Diversity and Inclusion, students are given the opportunity to learn more about diversity and the resources available to provide a more rewarding college experience.

CAMPUS SHUTTLE SYSTEM

The WSU Shuttle System is a service for students, faculty, staff and visitors to WSU. With two different routes available, it is provided as an alternative to parking on the WSU main campus.

OFFICE OF ONLINE LEARNING

OFFICE OF STUDENT SUCCESS

The Office of Student Success helps address the academic and social needs students have throughout their college careers. This office is committed to promoting the university's retention and graduation goals by creating and coordinating campus-wide initiatives that facilitate student success. Services and programs include: first-year programs such as orientation and WSU 101 and academic support programs such as tutoring and supplemental instruction.



PHYSICAL AND MENTAL WELLNESS

The mission of **STUDENT HEALTH SERVICES (SHS)** is to assist students in maintaining a state of optimum physical and mental wellness. SHS provides medical care and treatment for ill and injured students. Services also include health and wellness education, nutrition counseling and limited pharmacy services.

The **DENTAL HYGIENE CLINIC** accepts students as well as the general public as patients for dental hygiene treatment. Dental Hygiene majors get hands-on experience while providing a service at a reduced fee. The clinic provides teeth cleaning, exams by a dentist and x-rays when necessary.

WSU's **COUNSELING AND TESTING CENTER** provides psychological services for personal, learning and mental health issues. Professional counseling is available to all WSU students, faculty and staff. The center also offers academic testing services which include the credit by exam program, departmental exams, CLEP tests and entrance exams for colleges and graduate schools.

CAMPUS RECREATION

The **Intramural Sports Program** sponsors over 50 recreational-level leagues and tournaments. While the **Sport Club** program provides competitive-level events both regionally and nationally. Campus Recreation helps Shockers shape up physically and mentally through group fitness classes, massages and personal training.

The Heskett Center is home to all things Campus Recreation, with:

- 10,000 sq. ft. of state-of-the-art cardiovascular and strength and conditioning equipment
- a 25-foot climbing wall
- a 200 meter track
- racquetball courts and more!
