

**2 + 2 Articulation Agreement  
Wichita State University & Coffeyville Community College  
for  
Teacher Apprenticeship Program  
(Early Childhood Unified & Elementary Education, Birth-6<sup>th</sup> grade)  
and  
Elementary Education Program, K-6<sup>th</sup> grade**

The purpose of this 2 + 2 agreement is to provide Coffeyville Community College students the opportunity to transfer coursework from Coffeyville Community College to Wichita State University (WSU) in pursuit of a baccalaureate degree, with a major in Early Childhood Unified **and** Elementary Education, Birth-6<sup>th</sup> grade (online- TAP Program) **OR** Elementary Education, K-6<sup>th</sup> grade (face-to-face main campus program).

The 2 + 2 articulation agreement identifies requirements, options, equivalencies, and parameters, which will benefit many students for years to come. This document also includes a program of study with a list of equivalent Coffeyville Community College and WSU courses by term for the first two years at Coffeyville Community College, and a list of WSU courses to complete upon transfer to the four-year institution.

**Teacher Apprenticeship Program (Online Program):**

The agreement is for Coffeyville Community College who have:

- Earned an Associate in Arts (A.A.) in Elementary Education
- Achieved a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0
- Employed as a para educator at the ECU-6<sup>th</sup> grade level with instructional responsibilities within an interrelated or regular education classroom at a building accredited by KSDE (Kansas State Department of Education) or licensed by KDHE (Kansas Department of Health & Environment) or a similar setting
- Applied for admission to WSU as a transfer student or adult learner
- Completed program admission requirements ([www.wichita.edu/tap](http://www.wichita.edu/tap)) to the Teacher Apprenticeship Program

Students considered an adult learner or transfer student based on WSU admission requirements have the option to be dual enrolled in the TAP Program within teacher education courses and completing their general education course requirements at Coffeyville Community College in pursuit of their A.A. in Elementary Education by following the TAP degree plan outlined at this link. **Coffeyville Community College students meeting the above requirements for the TAP program will:**

- Be guaranteed admission to WSU with completion of application requirements and receipt of transcripts
- Enter with junior status towards a baccalaureate degree

- Meet WSU General Education Policy or KBOR policy
- Be guaranteed to transfer credits (100 level and higher) up to but not exceeding 60 credits with an earned grade of C- or better for general education foundation coursework, D- or higher for the other general education coursework, and B- or higher for specific teacher education coursework as designated on the program of study
- Earn 122 credit hours if they choose to complete the online, TAP (Teacher Apprenticeship Program) program. The TAP degree program at WSU requires a minimum of 120 credit hours, but because of degree requirements at both institutions this agreement will result in 122 credit hours earned

**OR**

**Elementary Education, K-6<sup>th</sup> grade (On Campus Program):**

The agreement is for Coffeyville Community College students who have:

- Earned an Associate in Arts (A.A) in Elementary Education
- Achieved a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5
- Applied for admission to WSU

**Coffeyville Community College students meeting the admission requirements for the on-campus program will:**

- Be guaranteed admission to WSU with completion of application requirements and receipt of transcripts
- Enter with junior status towards a baccalaureate degree
- Meet WSU General Education Policy or KBOR policy
- Be guaranteed to transfer credits (100 level and higher) up to but not exceeding 60 credits with an earned grade of C- or better for general education foundation coursework, D- or higher for the other general education coursework, and B- or higher for specific teacher education coursework as designated on the program of study
- Earn 134 credit hours if they choose to complete the on-campus Elementary Education, K-6<sup>th</sup> degree program. The Elementary Education, K-6<sup>th</sup> degree program at WSU requires a minimum of 120 credit hours, but because of degree requirements at both institutions this agreement will result in 134 credit hours earned.

## **Admission/Program/Graduation information**

**General Education Coursework:** The completion and transfer of general education coursework will vary based on the program of study for the specific Coffeyville Community College program. General education courses must be at least three (3) credit hours and from the approved general education course list at Wichita State University

(<https://www.wichita.edu/academics/generaleducation/>). Students transferring from Coffeyville Community College are required to meet the approved general education program at WSU at the time of transfer. Advisors and students should reference the Wichita State University Transfer

Students transferring to WSU from Coffeyville Community College who have completed an Associate in Arts must meet the necessary requirements for admission to WSU, and will have their transcript evaluated on an individual basis.

**Reverse Transfer:** Based on Reverse Transfer, candidates following the TAP or Elementary Education plan of study at WSU are eligible to utilize this process to complete required credit hours at Coffeyville Community College for the attainment of any Associate degree for which one is eligible (see Reverse transfer @ <https://www.wichita.edu/admissions/undergraduate/transfertowsu>)

**Graduation Requirements:** For graduation from the online WSU Teacher Apprentice Program with an Early Childhood Unified/Elementary Education degree **OR** the on-campus Elementary Education, K-6 program, students will need to fulfill transfer coursework from Coffeyville Community College along with all WSU general education requirements, degree requirements, and must meet all requirements for graduation as outlined by WSU.

All students, including those transferring from a two-year college, must complete at least 60 hours of four-year college work, including 45 hours of upper-division work, in order to qualify for graduation from Wichita State.



This agreement is subject to revision or cancellation by either Wichita State or Coffeyville Community College if necessary.
