

from Women of Wichita State University! Here is a little WSU women's history story for you to help commemorate Wichita State's 125th anniversary this year!

The Women of Wichita State University (WWSU) was formed on July 1, 2018 with the merger of two organizations: Women's Association (WA), formed in 1928, and Council of University Women (CUW), formed in 1930. Each organization was established to foster fellowship and friendliness among the female faculty, faculty wives, and staff while raising funds for scholarships for female students. WWSU continues with this tradition by encouraging and supporting women of all backgrounds.

Both WA and CUW established endowed general scholarships for non-traditional female students which continue to be awarded each year. In continuing with its philanthropic mission, WWSU established a third scholarship to be awarded annually to non-traditional female graduate or undergraduate students who have a minimum 3.0 GPA and are enrolled in at least 6 credit hours per semester. Payroll Deductions

As of 2021, all Wichita State University employees can contribute to the WWSU Scholarship Fund through payroll deductions!

Wichita State faculty and staff may gift any of the following:

- one-time contributions
- contributions of amounts to be taken out of paychecks in equal amounts
- contribution amounts to be taken out of each paycheck indefinitely

Contributions per pay period (minimum \$1) will continue until your total pledge amount has been reached or until otherwise specified on the form. It's your choice AND it's easy!

Instructions for Payroll Deduction donations to the WWSU Scholarship Fund:

- Complete the <u>WWSU Scholarship Fund Payroll Deduction Form</u>.
- 2. Return the form to Campus Box 38.
