- Developed Major Maps to align co- and extra-curricular opportunities with every major for all four years of a student's plan of study.
- Finalized a Chair Resource Manual and support materials for training new department chairs and assisting current chairs.
- Developed new bridge programs for incoming students with a focus on first-generation and under-represented minority students.

Strategic Planning / Assessment

- Implemented Years 3 through 5 of a new institutional Strategic Enrollment Management (SEM) plan. With 82 original tactics and 76 additional ones, we completed 49 tactics and marked an additional 99 as ongoing practices by incorporating these into our regular processes.*
- Accomplished a campus-wide 'refresh' on the University's Strategic Planning document as a
 member of the Steering Committee. This was a two-year effort with 10 campus-wide town
 halls with over 160 attendees on average, 12 Activation team meetings, and 11 Shared

 vision statement.*

Recruitment and Retention

- Led campus-wide enrollment management efforts that led to a return to pre-pandemic numbers and the largest freshman class in the history of the university for Fall 2021, and a 5% overall enrollment growth in Fall 2022.
- Held leaders across campus accountable for implementing our SEM plan, with the results of 6.5% overall growth in the first two years of my leadership, and only a 3% pandemic decline in Fall 2020 when the national average for four-year public institutions was -13%.*
- Envisioned and administered overall campaign to increase summer enrollments. This involved working with Deans and institutional research to identify bottleneck courses and courses with high demand that could enroll well over the summer, and working with Strategic Communications on an intensive marketing campaign to reach current and prospective students. The outcome was an increase in summer enrollment of 9% over three years.*
- Fostered and supported growth of the graduate enrollment management plan (GEM) as a part of the larger SEM plan. We saw 25% growth in graduate enrollments in Fall 2022.
- Strategically set agenda and convened weekly SEM committee meetings to tackle enrollment challenges, to enhance communication and coordination between offices in five different divisions on campus (Academic Affairs, Student Affairs, Strategic Communication, Financial Operations, and Foundation), and to identify new approaches to enhance recruitment and promote student success.*

• Encouraged and supported strategic new program development with the Teachers Apprentice Program in the School of Education (growth from 53 to 536 students in four years), the Bachelors in Media Arts in the School of Digital Arts (from 26 to 223 students in four years), the Master's in Human Resource Management in the College of Business (from 14 to 75 students in two years), and four new stackable certificates in Engineering Technology.

This required a comprehensive look at over \$9 million in annual revenue to make sure the shift would not unduly disadvantage certain areas.*
- Established new summer enrollment incentive structure for colleges to increase summer enrollments and revenue. Revenue sharing framework in place when targets were reached.
- Reassessed and revised the orientation fee structure to support student success and the First Year Experience on campus.*

Faculty Governance

- Convened campus-wide re-integration group and Faculty Curriculum Working Group as a part of the institutional COVID return-to-campus initiative. This group included a faculty member from each college, a Dean's representative from the Council of Deans, the past and current Faculty Senate Presidents, and two student representatives. We were primarily responsible for determining the modifications to the academic calendar, course schedule, class capacities, and classroom protocols in response to the pandemic.*
- Collaborated closely with the Faculty General Education committee to implement a required First Year Seminar for all incoming freshmen beginning in Fall 2021. This began with gathering data during a three-year pilot program before seeking Senate approval. It was followed by a two-year phased roll out, as over 50 new, unique FYS courses were developed and approved, and new program assessment processes were put in place. The program was managed by an FYS Faculty Coordinator who reported to me.*

- Partnered with Human Resources to benchmark faculty salaries, identify inequities, and make appropriate adjustments for internal equity and external parity with peers.^
- Facilitated dialogue between faculty and administration on revisions to University Policy Manual, including a full review of the chapter on Faculty.^
- Served as WSU's representative at the Council of Faculty Senate Presidents (CoFSP) at monthly Kanas Board of Regents (KBOR) meetings.^
