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Welcome back to school! By the time this newsletter reaches most students and school officials, the new school year will be in full swing. The TRIO Talent Search program staff is looking forward to working with students at their schools as well as online, when necessary and convenient. The program will continue to offer online advising and mentoring sessions for students when an in-person visit with the Talent Search counselor isn't possible during regular school hours. The program will not be offering online tutoring due to the low numbers of students who have utilized that service over the past two years. However, the program will continue to offer the in-person After-School Tutoring Program (ASTP) on the third floor of Brennan Hall I. on the WSU 3-6 p.m., Monday through Thursday. The ASTP will main campus from commence September 12th. Students needn't make an appointment and may show up any time they need help with math or other homework. Students are encouraged to take advantage of this service to stay on top of their homework and to improve their grades. The program will also be offering nine campus visits to regional colleges and universities. Featured visits include K-State, KU, OSU, and WSU in addition to other four-year and two-year institutions. Summer is over and a new school year is beginning. The start of something new can sometimes be overwhelming, with lots of new faces, teachers, and other challenges too! Students this can be stressful and even cause anxiety. An exercise to do for coping with anxiety is deep breathing. Deep breathing is a simple technique for managing emotions. Not only is deep breathing effective, but it's also discreet and easy to use at any time or place. How to use deep breathing: sit comfortably and place one hand on your abdomen. Breathe in through your nose, deeply enough that the hand on your abdomen rises. Hold the air in your lungs, and then exhale slowly through your mouth, with your lips puckered as if you are blowing through a straw. The secret is to go slow: Time the inhalation (4 seconds), pause (4 seconds), and exhalation (6 seconds). Remember, TRIO Talent Search is here for students. Have a GREAT year!

The College Scorecard tool at <u>https://collegescorecard.ed.gov</u> can assist students in researching their colleges of choice. 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ACT Test Dates For 2022-2023

Hello students and welcome back to school! Hope everyone had a great summer break. The TRIO Talent Search staff is

excited and ready to serve students once again as they return to school. Soon, it will be time for students to prepare for the ACT test. TRIO Talent Search can provide two fee waivers for students that are eligible. Fee waivers will cover registration and late fees for either ACT test (no writing or with writing). Also, students that are currently enrolled in high school in 10th, 11th or 12th grade can take the ACT test. If students meet one or more of the indicators for economic needs such as participating in the free or reduced lunch program at school, based on U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) income levels, they are more likely to meet the eligibility requirements.
