

MIDDLE SCHOOL SUMMER ENRICHMENT PROGRAM (SEP) 2023



SEP HIGHLIGHTS





Twenty-two select middle school students received class instruction in English, computer science/robotics, math, financial literacy/life skills, as well as music and performing arts.

Students participated in a field trip to the Sedgwick County Zoo and attended campus visits to Southwestern College, Langston University (HBCU), Fort Hays State University, Johnson County Community College, and the College of the Ozarks.

SEP guest speakers included Sgt. Michael Roets, WPD Mounted Police; Brandon and William Polite, Ph.D., co-authors of Protect Your Mind; Chukwunenye Nweke, Mental Health Counselor for WSU's Counseling and Prevention Services; and Kevin Harrison, Ph.D., assistant professor and director for WSU's Office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion.

Meritrust Credit Union co-hosted an interactive Reality U event that teaches youth about personal finance and at the end of the summer program, students performed in the Academic Awards Recognition and Talent Show. The SEP was held on the Wichita State campus.

This annual workshop is scheduled for Monday, September 18. Its purpose is to help students plan and make informed decisions about postsecondary education. The Talent Search-South staff collaborate with the Talent Search program to provide students with information on various program services offered, including tutoring, mentoring, homework assistance, financial literacy (FAFSA, scholarship searches), and assistance with course selection, college admission applications, fee waivers, and more. Students enrolled in the Talent Search-South program are also eligible to attend college campus tours to gain a first-hand view of potential colleges or universities beyond the brochures with opportunities to engage in conversations about academic options and campus culture from campus staff and students.

During College Jump Start, participants learn multiple things to consider when choosing a postsecondary school, including admissions requirements, fee waivers, the real cost of higher education, high school graduation requirements, and how ACT and GPA scores influence college admission. Presenters will delve into each of these topics and share how the program can assist with career exploration, mentoring, and dispelling financial aid myths.

Not only is the event informational, it is an opportunity for students to connect with their peers and learn more about what the Talent Search-South program can do to aid in the successful future of its youth.

With the new school year approaching it's time to start thinking about how to pay for college. It is important for students to stay on top of scholarship and new FAFSA information.

FAFSA:

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is changing for the 2023-2024 school year and the new FAFSA website will not be available until December 2023. Students need to ensure that they keep an eye out for news regarding when the website will open. Keep in mind, just because the FAFSA is opening later does not mean some colleges are extending their financial aid deadline. Students need to remain informed with the latest information.



Students must submit the FAFSA form by the priority deadline to be considered for the aid programs administered by their state. There is also a federal deadline each academic year. - studentaid.gov

Scholarships:

Looking for ways to pay for college without using student loans? Try applying for these scholarships.

Rudd Scholarship

- ♦ Must be a graduating high school senior who plans to enroll full-time in the fall.
- ◆ Must have a cumulative, unweighted high school GPA of 3.0 or above.
- Must be a Kansas resident and qualify for in-state tuition.
- ♦ Will attend either Emporia State, Fort Hays State, or Wichita State.
- Must be a U.S. Citizen or a permanent resident.

Gates Scholarship

- ♦ Minimum 3.3 GPA
- Full-ride scholarship.

Apply as early as possible!
