# Ronald Reagan Student Leadership Program

The program offers student-driven activities to cultivate leadership skills, mentoring opportunities, connections to peers across the nation, and a Leadership Action Plan to increase civic engagement and improve services to the community. Program alumni have received significant college scholarship awards and have led projects which have positive impacts on their communities. Here is Kimberly's account of this important event.

"At the beginning of the Ronald Reagan Student Leadership Program (SLP), we introduced ourselves and talked about what we liked. This helped us to know more about a lot of people so that we be could be more confident and comfortable talking to other students.

During the SLP, we played games that were a lot of fun. We also participated in a debating activity, talked about the personality compass, and participated in a discussion about leadership action plans, using "why" statements. For example, I wondered why people choose to do certain activities or sell certain things. My why statement is that I want to sell my art because some people think art is calming and cool to look at.

One of the most valuable things I learned during the SLP is that we need to support and value each other's opinions. I also learned about helping homeless people and making cool things for the homeless shelter. I especially liked it when the SLP ambassadors gave me suggestions on what to do with my homeless shelter project including, for example, to maximize resources and limit the accumulation of food waste. My group developed a plan to have leftover fruits and vegetables transferred from the public schools to the homeless shelters. Based on my experience, I would 100 percent recommend for students to participate in the SLP."

Returning to school this fall is going to be an unusual challenge for all. Talent Search is here to help by offering virtual tutoring, homework assistance, as well as in-person tutoring by appointment only.

Tutoring services for grades 6-12 will begin on September 21, 2020 and held Monday-Friday at various times in most subject areas. Virtual tutoring will be offered using Google Classroom. Inperson tutoring will be held in Brennan Hall 1, room 314 from 3-6 p.m. (M-Th). All in-person tutoring will follow the necessary health and safety guidelines to protect both students and staff.

In addition, the program is partnering with Method Test Prep to offer math tutoring from 7-8 p.m. (M-Th) for middle school and high school courses. ## ACT Update

With the ongoing COVID-19 crisis, everyone is trying to figure out how to navigate and overcome the current reality.

Students may be dealing with a myriad of emotions and it is okay to express those feelings. Just know that TRIO Talent Search is here to offer support and help students find positive ways to cope and succeed.

Soon, it will be time to prepare for the ACT test. Testing schedules at Wichita high schools may vary considering that 6-12 grade students are attending school remotely. Students need to contact their school liaison before registering for the ACT to make sure their school is an authorized test center.

Seniors need to pay close attention to the scholarship application requirements on each website they apply to. Many may find that ACT scores are not excused as an application requirement; however, many colleges may excuse ACT scores for admissions requirements. Unfortunately, Talent Search will not be able to offer in-person ACT prep workshops this fall. However, tutors are available to assist with test subjects. ACT practice tests can also be found at www.act.org.
