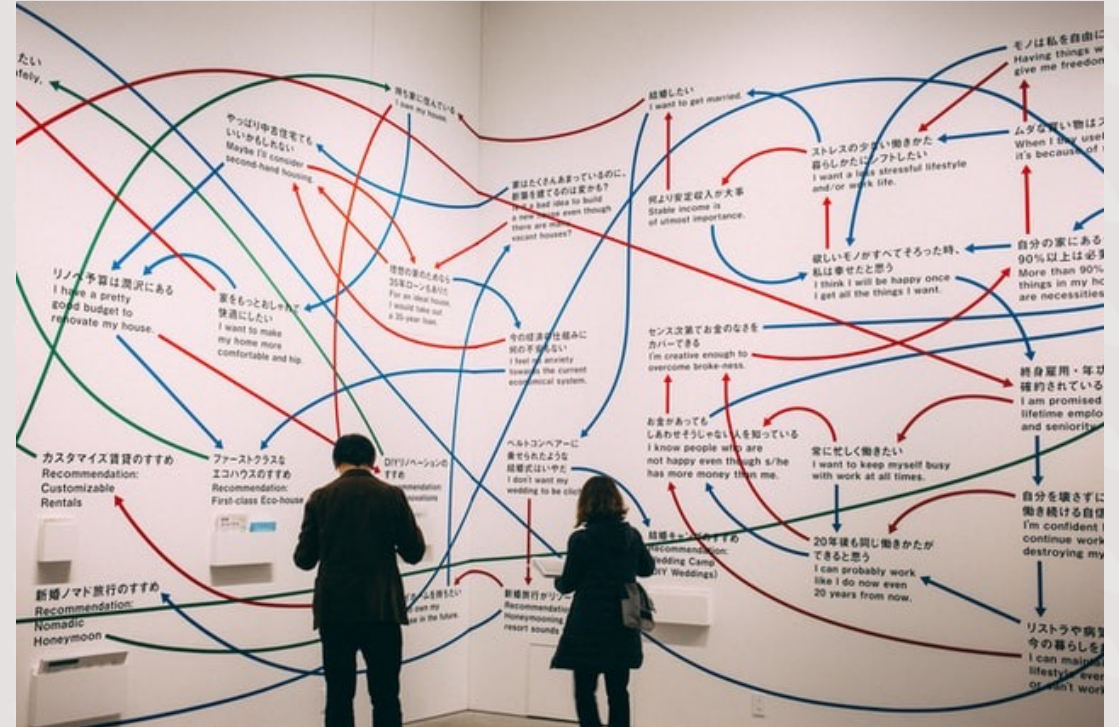

What is mapping?



- Systematic way to track what is being both taught and learned throughout an educational experience
- Possible at the course level, program level, and institutional level
- Produces data that is useful for assessment at all levels as well

What does mapping require?

- Clear educational goals (aka: outcomes/objectives/standards)
- Information about the educational curriculum
- Agreed-upon assessment strategies
- Systematic review



How is mapping done?



- Can be done from the ground up or after development
- Step 1: know what you want students to learn at the end
- Step 2: Identify the difference between introduction, mastery, assessment
- Step 3: Systematically identify where each step takes place
- Step 4: “Fix” areas where a step is missed
- Step 5: Review regularly

Advantages of mapping



- Provides an opportunity for goal review
- Explicitly shows where program is meeting its own goals
- Clearly illustrates needs in a way easily communicated to others
- Supports assessment
- Supports curriculum review and improvement

Does mapping undermine spontaneity?

- No!
- Provides structure for instructors, not limitations
