# **Spring Break**



#### **How Can Families Help?**

- Encourage your student to think through potential consequences of spring break activities.
- If they haven't already, your student should be scheduling an <u>advising</u> <u>appointment</u> to begin the enrollment process for next semester.
- Try to strike a balance between serious discussions about future planning/choices with your student and finding time to just enjoy each

- other's company.
- If your student is worried about how their semester is going, remind them about campus resources including <u>Supplemental Instruction</u>, <u>Student</u> <u>Success</u>, <u>tutoring</u> and <u>advisors</u>. <u>Professors</u> are always open to helping students get on track. Now is the time to ask for help!

# **Campus Housing News**



**Room Selection season is coming soon!** Students will receive an email one week before their timeslot opens for Room Selection. At that time, or any time after, students can login to their Housing Portal through MyWSU and open their 2025-26 Academic Year Application.

Don't worry if your student is busy at the time they are assigned, the timeslot is simply the first time a student can login to complete Room Selection but will be open any time after as well.

Only students who have completed the application, paid the \$75 application fee, and paid the \$200 pre-payment will receive a Room Selection timeslot email. Once these three steps are completed, a student will go through Room Selection at the appropriate time. See timeline below.

#### **Room Selection Timeline**

- Third & Fourth Week of March- Returning Students, LLC, and Gender Inclusive applicants begin their room selection based on their complete date
- Second Week of April- New Student applicants begin general room selection based on their complete date
- Fourth Week of April- Open room selection begins for all students who have applied later or have not received a timeslot at this point

# It's Time to Schedule and Academic Advising Appointment

Enrollment for fall 2025 begins April 7, 2025! Classes tend to fill up quickly so now is a great time for your student to schedule an academic advising appointment. Academic advisors are partners with your student to promote their success and help them graduate in a timely manner. While scheduling classes is one area advisors work with students, it is a critical piece as academic advisors have professional training to ensure they are informed on the nuances of academic major and graduation requirements. Additionally, academic advisors form partnerships with students in the following ways:

- Assist students to set short- and long-term goals.
- Provide career information regarding the degree fields of interest.
- Inform students about university policies and procedures important to a student's progress.
- Draw upon a comprehensive knowledge of campus resources and assist students in referral and access to such services.

Your student can schedule an advising appointment via Navigate (found on the myWSU portal). Not sure who their advisor is? Go to wichita.edu/advising and click on "Find Your Academic Advisor".



#### **OneStop Student Services is here 24/7**

Have questions about financial aid? Paying a bill? Enrollment? OneStop Student Services is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year. Students keep "unique" schedules and we are here to answer questions on demand. Below are answers to questions you may have.

- **Q. Who do you work with?** We work with all enrolled students from the time they register for the first time through graduation and grad school. If you are an enrolled student at Wichita State, we are here for you.
- Q. Will I be talking to a bot? No, you will be talking/chatting with a real person.

  Q. How do you know it's really me? Students are required to create a OneStop Access Code and answer a series of questions of so we can authenticate it is truly them. This allows us to provide security to student data and ensure we provide accurate information to the correct person.
- Q. Can I, the parent, access this? It depends. Once students enroll in college they are protected by the Federal Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). Students have to give parents/guardians/step parents permission to see or hear about the student record. If you don't have access but want it, please talk to your student about signing you up through the myWSU portal. Remember, their decision is protected by federal law so even if you are paying for their schooling, they can say no.
- Q. Do you help students set up payment plans, make payments, etc.? We provide them with the tools to do so, included written, email instructions, but they are required to set these up. If a student is at a computer, we'll stay on the line while they set it up and confirm it worked but ultimately, it's the students responsibility.

#### **Measles Update:**

As of February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2025 this site shows zero active measles cases in Kansas. Two doses of the MMR or MMRV vaccine are recommended by doctors as the best way to protect against measles, mumps, and rubella. Look at you and your child's immunization records to make sure that there are 2 doses of MMR and MMRV at least 28 days apart. One dose of MMR vaccine is 93% effective against measles with TWO doses 97% effective against measles. International travel could be facilitating the spread of the measles outbreak as having cases of active disease in some countries is still common. Protect yourself with vaccination.


