How do you persevere?</p> <p>Your essay must follow the rubric posted on the webpage and must follow the instructions listed on the scholarship application.</p> <p>NOTES:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> If you are applying for more than one endowed scholarship, <u>you cannot duplicate essays</u>. Answer your questions by providing relevant examples. <p>Participation Points will be awarded as bonus points to current SSS students who refer new students to the SSS program, who meet with their SSS advisor on a monthly basis, and who attend SSS workshops.</p>
