Campus Recreation at Wichita State University plays a vital role in enhancing the student experience by fostering a sense of community, promoting mental and physical well-being, and supporting student success through inclusive and engaging programs and services.

Fostering Community and Enhancing Retention

A strong sense of belonging is directly linked to student retention, and Campus Recreation is proud to contribute to this through a wide range of events and activities. In FY25, we hosted over 20 social, cultural, and educational events that brought students together outside the classroom. More than 25 intramural sports provided opportunities for students to challenge themselves physically and mentally, while our sport clubs and Shocker Rowing team helped students build leadership skills and camaraderie. Our facilities welcomed hundreds of students, faculty, staff, and community members, and we proudly supported over 125 student employees—each one gaining valuable work experience in a supportive, student-centered environment.

Supporting Mental Health Through Activity and Engagement

Campus Recreation is uniquely positioned to positively impact mental health through physical activity and community engagement. Participation in Sport Clubs has doubled over the past three years, reflecting a growing demand for connection and movement. Exercise is a proven tool for reducing anxiety, enhancing mood, improving sleep, and boosting cognitive function. Our programs help students manage stress, build self-esteem, and maintain a healthy lifestyle—all of which contribute to academic success and retention.

Recruitment and Community Engagement

Campus Recreation actively supports university recruitment efforts through community-based initiatives such as Boats and Bikes, Club Parkinson's partnerships, swim lessons, and large-scale events like the Pumpkin Run and Wellness Expo. We collaborate with Admissions during Black and Yellow Days to showcase our facilities and programs to prospective students. The Student Shocker Navigators regularly tour the Heskett Center, highlighting the role Campus Recreation plays in student life. Additionally, the Shocker Rowing team directly recruits students who may not have otherwise considered Wichita State, expanding our reach and impact.

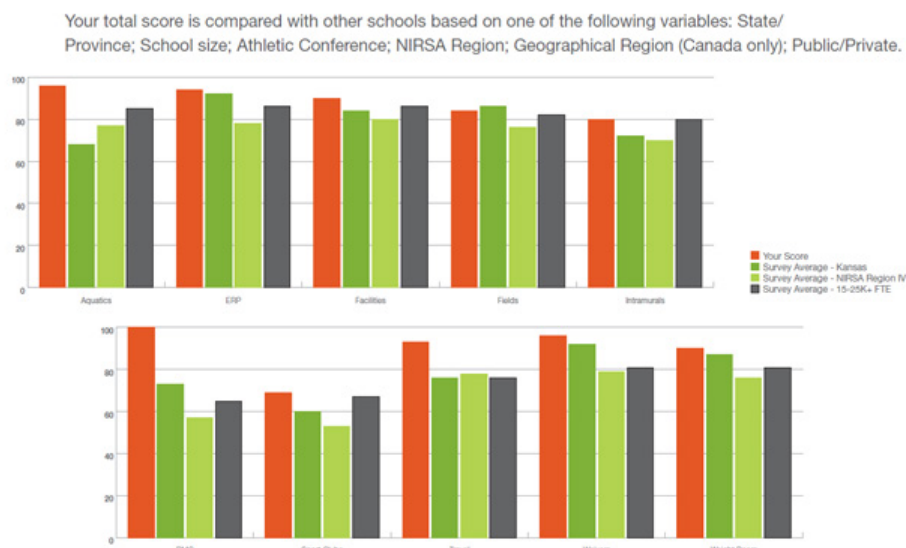

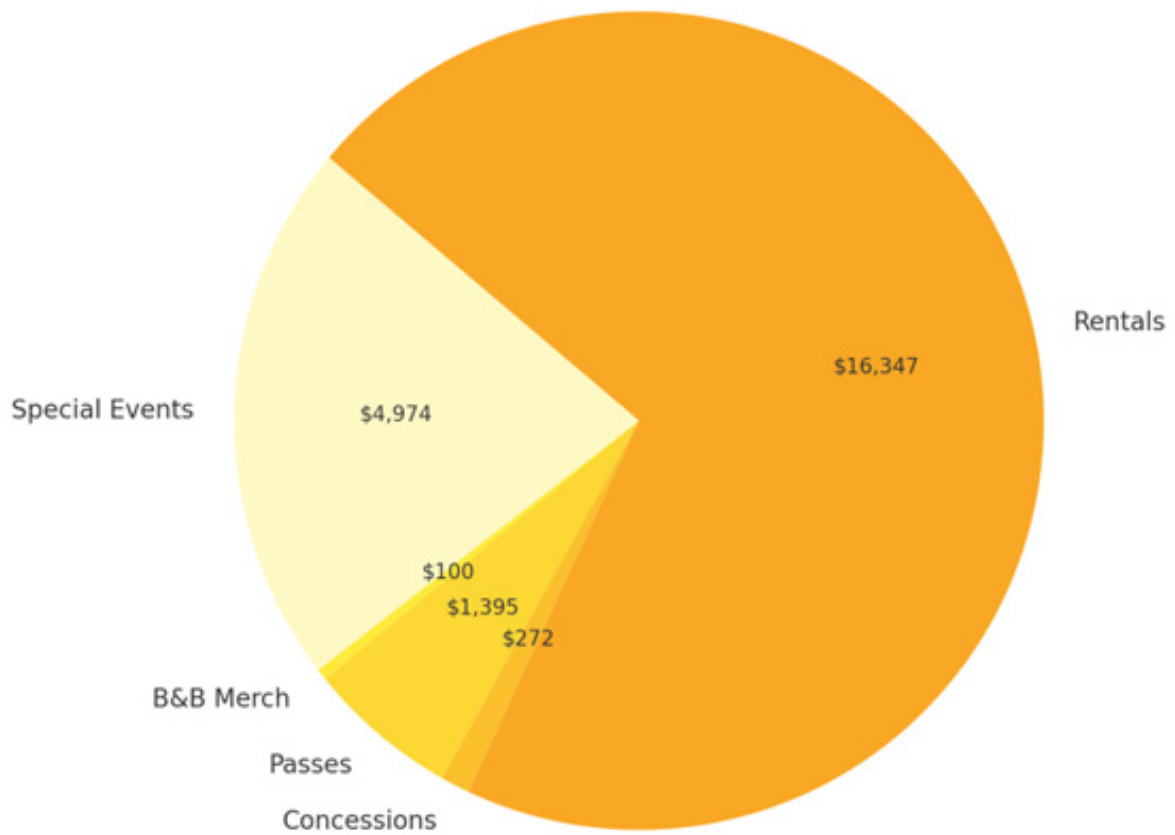
